Methodology

Poll number: pr2009

Interview Dates: May 9-12, 2020

Sample Population: 588 likely voters in North Carolina.

Sample Selection: Scientific online poll - stratified sample of panel respondents.

Weighting Parameters: The sample was weighted based on the U.S. Census Bureau's Voting and Registration Supplement to the Current Population Survey for registered voters in North Carolina based on age, gender, race, educational attainment. After weighting, respondents were filtered on their likelihood to vote in the upcoming November 2020 elections.

This topline provides weighted percentages, as well as the unweighted N-size for the total sample. Due to the effects of weighting and rounding, figures may or may not add up to 100%. The standard deviation of the weights was: 0.1593609. The maximum weight was: 1.4337834. The minimum weight was: 0.6589204. 95% of the weights were between 0.7608404, 1.3718341.

Margin of Error: The 95% credibility interval for this survey is +/- 4.1%, which includes the square root of the design effect (DEFT): 1.0127114.
